I. Call to order

The meeting was called to order at 11:35 AM by the chair.

II. Approval of minutes from September 7 meeting Leigh moved to approve the minutes. Ruth seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

III. Business and Finance

A. July Treasurer's Report

Jill moved to approve the July Treasurer's Report. Ruth seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

C. Treasurer's Housekeeping

Leigh reported that former treasurer Kathleen Pfeffer has taken care of changing the filing date of state taxes and has filed those taxes. Leigh will file our Federal 990 in November. We have the names on the bank account switched to Leigh and Jill. Leigh is taking care of necessary changes to PayPal. The last change needed is that to the name on our PO Box. Leigh will organize for herself, Carol Hart, and Jill to meet at the Mariposa Post Office sometime soon to take care of this.

The group reviewed the 2018-2019 budget overview document. No changes.

IV. Fundraising

A. Fall Fundraiser at Savoury's Nov 4

For a variety of reasons, including not enough time for planning and advertising, the group agreed to cancel the fall fundraising event at Savoury's. There was discussion of adding a dance party either the weekend of Jan 25-26, or sometime between then and April, to replace this event this year. Jill will check into Bootjack Stompers Hall to see if it is available and if they allow alcohol. Leigh will check into rules around serving alcohol (we think if it is donated and we ask for donations, no liquor license is needed, but Leigh will check).

B. Season of Giving Campaign

Jill will update last year's letter, including a new photo of Associated Student Body members to be taken by Brian Moczygemba. The goal is to start sending out the letters on November 1. Jill will bring copies of letters, envelopes and our current distribution list to the next meeting so that members can add names and distribute them to their networks as well. Leigh will look into a way for us to include a link to PayPal in the letter in case people would like to pay that way.

Jill has completed all the steps necessary for ABC to participate in this Facebook campaign this year and so we will. Leigh will look into a way for us to add PayPal to our Facebook page.

A. Career Lunches

i. Oct 11, Nick Lambert, Lambert Tech Services

We are on track to have Nick Lambert speak to students on Oct 11.

ii. Schedule of speakers

A May speaker is not yet scheduled, but Tara has ideas from last meeting and is working on filling this last spot.

B. Community Connections

Kathleen noted that she has 7 potential mentors in various points of completing initial steps. One hold up is that the Health Dept is backed up with their monthly clinic - people have to call to make an appointment and they are currently months out. Leigh will contact Dr. Sergienko at the Health Dept to see if there is any way to move things up for our Community Connections volunteers.

Kathleen spoke with Celeste about scheduling a workshop with Sierra Quest and will do so now, inviting potential mentors even if they have not completed volunteer screening. This will keep the process moving along. Kathleen will see if Sierra Quest is okay with having people attend the training who haven't committed to being mentors yet but are interested in seeing what the training is like to help them make a decision. Once we have the date for the training, Jill will forward this information to AAUW in case there are any last minute AAUW members who have been thinking about it who want to attend.

D. Career Evening (Find Your Z) committee update

Discussion clarified that this event will run from afternoon to early evening with two sessions and a break between them. It is meant to be both a fundraiser and a service to high school students and the greater community. Speakers changed from our initial group discussion of recent MCHS grads to people of all ages who have an interesting story to tell about their career path. Professional football player and MCHS grad Cody Wichmann has agreed to be one of the speakers. Since he is likely to be a big draw, we will try to find a date that works for him in late January/early Feb 2020 and build around that. Jill will check a few potential dates with Celeste to make sure there isn't already a big FFA or other type of event scheduled. The committee plans to meet again next Friday.

E. Dinner with a Scientist

AAUW Dinner with the Scientist is happening Wednesday, October 17. Since Jill is also a member of AAUW and takes photos of the event for them, she will be going as both an AAUW and ABC representative.

F. Grizzly Improv, 2nd night - idea from Bryan Starchman The group liked this idea and brainstormed names of some community members who might draw an audience and be willing. Jill will let Bryan know that we are interested in this idea and see what he is thinking in terms of timing - if it would happen the night after the student version or on another date.

VI. High School Curriculum that's been brought up for discussion

A. Draft PE requirement letter There were no suggested additions or changes to the draft letter. Jill will include information

about the letter in our next e-newsletter and on Facebook asking anyone with current or future students at MCHS interested in having their name included to please respond with an email or IM. ABC members will also ask the people they know. For anyone interested in being included, we will need their name and email address or phone number (easy way for MCUSD to get in touch if they want to check the list). Please do not send names one by one to Jill, but rather collect them and get a list to Jill by Friday, October 19.

VII. Open Forum

Jill shared the email she received from Brooke Dobson regarding volunteer help with photocopying for teachers and also Celeste's response. No one at the meeting expressed interest in volunteering to make photocopies. Jill will put the request in the next e-newsletter and see if we get any responses. Another idea was to see if we can pay a student to do this before school starts on late start Fridays. Kathleen will ask about this option.

What is ABC working on this school year?

Career Lunches - We are continuing this program of bringing in speakers from a wide variety of fields to talk with students about the paths they took to their careers and what their jobs are like. At the same time, we provide students with lunch from local eating establishments. We have wonderful speakers scheduled through June. Estimated cost this school year: \$1,500.

Community Connections - This program is all about pairing caring adults with students who could use the positive influence of an adult (or another adult) in their lives. Community members have volunteered and are in the process of getting cleared as volunteers and trained as mentors. MCHS plans to have mentors matched to students in a pilot program to start very soon. ABC is funding one outing (lunch or other event) per month, plus additional funds for a small gift on student birthdays. Once the program is up and running successfully, we will work with MCHS on expanding it to more students. Initial cost for one year: \$2,700.

UC Merced Lab Tours - ABC will once again make arrangements with UC Merced to take a bus full of students to campus for tours of various labs. We did this for the first time last year and it was a very popular event. The tours will happen in the Spring and are open to ALL students interested in the sciences. Planning is in progress! Estimated cost: \$750.

Passport to Success - Every quarter, the Counseling Office asks teachers and tutors how many students have been getting help outside of class time based upon guidelines. We then give the teachers and tutors \$10 gift cards to hand out directly to the students. The gift cards are to the student's choice of Dabbles, Pizza Factory, Yosemite Treats, or Jantz Bakery. Counselors also give the students notes of congratulations and encouragement to keep up the good work. Estimated cost: \$500.

Teacher/Group Requests - Last year, ABC helped fund t-shirts for Cross Training PE students, upgraded quiz programs for Spanish and French teachers, cover travel costs for the Academic Decathlon, and more. We look forward to funding more requests that benefit students this school year! Estimated cost: \$2,200.

Personal Best Awards - At the beginning of each school year, MCHS staff work with students on setting goals. Given at the end of the year, Personal Best Awards will recognize at least one student in each grade level who has personally made significant progress toward their goals. MCHS is responsible for determining the details and the prizes. Cost: \$1,000.

Academic Achievement Night - Starting sophomore year, academic letters (for putting on sweaters or jackets or displaying on walls) are given to students who maintain a 3.5 or greater grade point average throughout the year in recognition of their hard work and positive outcomes. In subsequent years, students who previously earned letters are then eligible to earn bars to add to them. ABC is happy to sponsor the letters and bars given out at MCHS's Achievement Night at the end of each school year. Cost: \$400.

Dear SSAE Grant Panel:

The MCHS Academic Boosters Club (ABC) is very much in support of the School-Based Mobile Health Center project for Mariposa County. Our mission is to ensure that every Mariposa County High School student has the academic resources they require to excel. We see this project as tightly aligned to ours given that having health needs met certainly also affects the ability to excel. High school students are, of course, in elementary school first, so ensuring that needs are met at all ages is of interest to us.

Mariposa is a very rural 1,450 square mile county with a high number of its 1,700 students living near poverty. Schools are spread out throughout the county with only one school nurse to attend to them all. The great majority of students attend MCHS for high school.

ABC recently learned that in CAASPP reading proficiency tests, Mariposa County third-graders score below the State average – 24% as compared to 37% statewide. As educators, you know poor reading level performance is a predictor of lower academic performance throughout the remainder of the child's education. Lower reading levels are also a predictor of poorer socio-economic and other life outcomes.

ABC was formed to address issues such as these in the high school years through targeted investment in Mariposa County High School students. For instance, before it was taken over by Mariposa County Behavioral Health, ABC was happy to provide funding to MCHS for Natural Helpers, a peer-based support program to improve the social and emotional well-being of other students. Improvement in school experiences and feelings of connectedness help improve attendance which places students in a better position to not miss key, foundational lessons in reading and math.

ABC believes a School-Based Mobile Health Center can assist in linking students starting in the early years and throughout high school with the services they need to be ready to learn and thrive. ABC is comprised of parents and community leaders. We are committed to providing the input, planning, outreach, and encouragement for the use of the School-Based Mobile Health Center over the term of the grant and beyond.

Our rural children and families need this additional support. A grant from the Panel would provide a significant head start to our school district and Mariposa County Health & Human Services in addressing an unmet need that would positively impact the children of our county.

Background

- Between all the Park Partners, there are thousands of employees working at Yosemite National Park each year, covering an incredibly wide and diverse range of occupations and skill sets.
- Yosemite Park High School, located in El Portal, is a Necessary Small School that currently does not have any job skills or mentoring programs. Attendance varies between 3 and 10 students, with enrollment often hampered by a lack of electives and enhancements.
- Mariposa County High School has multiple Career Pathway programs, but currently none that utilize Yosemite National Park .
- Mariposa County Unified School District is committed to providing every student the opportunity to be College & Career Ready when they graduate.

Benefits for Park Partners & MCUSD

- Provides increased opportunities for local Yosemite Park High School.
- Increases opportunities for Mariposa County High School, which serves the majority of our park students, as well as many disadvantaged students that might not otherwise experience Yosemite.
- Increase Mariposa County awareness of employment opportunities in Yosemite
- Foster a "grow our own" mentality for future employees
- The F.P.S.M. program (yeah, we're still working on the title) will hopefully blend with Park initiatives by bringing into Yosemite a diverse group of youth that will grow into future park partners.

Structures In Place

- MCUSD has a College, Career, Community Liaison housed at MCHS that can serve as a "point person" for MCUSD and Liaison to Park Partners
 - Process to "match" students to opportunities
 - Vetting of appropriate, responsible youth
- MCUSD can create an MOU to delineate responsibilities
- MCUSD can provide a blanket of liability coverage over Park Partners
- MCUSD has a "Community Classroom" agreement
- MCUSD has evaluation and feedback forms for students/partners

<u>Proposal</u>

- Partners to identify potential guest speakers for MCUSD activities
- Partners to commit to ONE job shadow experience per month for a student
- Partners to consider intern/work experience (paid or nonpaid) opportunities for students
- MCUSD to provide a summer employment fair for Park Partners to hire students/graduates
- Partners/MCUSD to coordinate TEACHER field trip to learn more about Park Partner opportunities
