I. Call to order

Jill called the meeting to order at 11:35 AM.

II. Approval of minutes from September 27 meeting Tara moved to approve the minutes. Amy seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

III. Business and Finance

A. August Treasurer's Report

At the end of July, our balance was \$22,534.04. We had a \$756 refund from our insurance payment and withdrawals for Valedictorian program printing costs and MCHS academic letters and bars, both left over from last school year. Our ending balance on August 30 was \$22,242.22. Amy moved to approve the report, Tara seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

B. 2019-2020 Budget Overview

Costs for this school year are starting to be plugged in as they occur. No major changes to report.

C. Insurance update

Leigh received our new insurance policy and sent in a check. We have not yet received the policy for our Nov 1 Gold Coin party. We will keep checking the mail this week.

D. Tax filing update

Leigh filed our taxes for our 2018-2019 fiscal year.

E. Bobman/History field trip request

Stephanie Bobman sent in a grant request in the amount of \$348.60 to take her 48 CCAP US History students on a field trip to the Mariposa Museum and History Center. Since the field trip was going to take place before this meeting, Jill sent the request to board members via email and it was unanimously approved. Ms. Bobman reported back that students had a great time and she sent Jill pictures to post.

IV. Programs/Events

A. Career Lunch

1. October recap - Jenni Kiser

Ten students attended. Jenni did a great job. Tara mentioned that we're now offering incentives, we've updated the flyer, we are varying the lunch options. It seems we are doing all we can to attract students.

2. Nov 14 - Cody Guenthart

Tara will get info Kathy for announcements, Kass for flyer, and Jill for social sharing two weeks out.

B. Party @ the Gold Coin planning (Nov 1)

PR, ticket sales, silent auction items, volunteers night of,

face painting, games, ...

Jill is posting daily. As of Monday, ticket sales were low, but maybe people are waiting until the last minute. Silent auction items continue to come in. Tara will drop off corn hole before heading to football away game. Leigh will try to make ping pong tournament happen. All agreed to having the face painter at the event for 2 hours at \$50/hr. We will charge \$20 for up to a half a face. Leigh will get money and have credit card reader. Jill will bring money box. Ruth will stop by the Gold Coin, talk to James about room set up the night of, and will send us a diagram of where things will be. Trish will get there at 4, help with set up, and can be the first money collector at the door. Jill, Leigh, and Amy will also be there for set up. Ruth will keep an eye on food during the night. Jill will keep an eye on silent auction items. Stephanie is available to help with money collection or any other way.

C. Community Connections update

Kathy reported that three mentors from last year have been matched with three new students this year. She has received calls of interest from a number of people and is afraid the packet she sends is overwhelming so will work on cutting down the initial information that is sent to potential mentors.

D. "On the Right Track" event

Kathy has the information we discussed last year around this type of event but has not yet spoken with Celeste. We talked about holding it next fall for seniors on the day that the rest of the school is taking the PSAT. It's also much easier to manage 100+ students through such an event than 450+ students. Also, this way, it can potentially become and annual event. Kathy will speak to Celeste about it and we will discuss again at our next meeting. Trish has information from Junior Achievement about a similar type of event that she will get to Kathy.

E. Yosemite Fire/MCHS Fire meeting

The two groups are set to meet either November 8 or November 14. Kathy will attend the meeting and take notes so that we can help with any "go forwards," or she will let Jill know if she needs someone else from ABC to attend in her place.

F. Yosemite Art/Ansel Adams Gallery meeting

Pete Bothwell has been in touch with the manager of the Ansel Adams Gallery. Part of the requirement around making his classes CTE approved involves having an advisory committee and the manager of the gallery would be a good fit for this.

E. Season of Giving letter campaign

It will look very similar to last year's letter with a new photo. Jill will work on getting these out mid-November. We'll also be participating in Facebook's #GivingTuesday which is the Tuesday after Thanksgiving.

G. Spa Day fundraising idea

Kass Bissmeyer asked Jill and Leigh about ABC's interest in putting on a Spa Day type of fundraiser around Mother's Day. The idea is that we charge \$100/person and they can come get their hair cut, massage, nails done, face mask, etc, and have chardonnay/champagne & snacks. We would pay those doing the work a set amount, maybe \$100-\$150 for the day and the rest would be profit. She could see partnering with Mountain Fitness or Yogasemite or @Natalya's Salon.

Sierra Foothill Charter School typically holds a Spa Day fundraiser at the Bug in November including hot tub, sauna, face masks, kids activities, dinner, campfire. This would be at the opposite time of year and in town and aimed at women for Mother's Day.

Kass is willing to take this on if she has a co-leader. Everyone liked the idea but no one was willing to volunteer as co-leader. We will bring this to the table again next month, after our current fundraiser.

V. Open Forum

Jill expressed sadness that we will be losing Amy as a member and her whole family as part of our community at the end of the year as Mike has been transferred to a different park. All echoed these sentiments. Amy has been a valuable part of our team. We will enjoy her continuing to be so for a few more months.

Trish brought the bill for food from Dinner with a Scientist and Jill wrote a check for ABC's portion: \$600.

What is ABC working on this school year?

Career Lunches - We are continuing this program of bringing in speakers from a wide variety of fields to talk with students about the paths they took to their careers and what their jobs are like. At the same time, we provide students with lunch from local eating establishments. We have wonderful speakers scheduled through June. Estimated cost this school year: \$1,500.

Community Connections - This program is all about pairing caring adults with students who could use the positive influence of an adult (or another adult) in their lives. Last year, after getting cleared as volunteers and trained as mentors, five community members spent time with five students. MCHS is working to expand the program to match more mentors and students this year. ABC funds one outing (lunch or other event) per month, plus additional funds for a small gift on student birthdays. Estimated cost this year: \$2,700.

UC Merced Lab Tours - ABC will once again make arrangements with UC Merced professors to take a bus full of students to campus for tours of various labs. This will be our third year organizing this very popular event. The tours will happen in the spring and are open to ALL students interested in the sciences. Planning is in progress! Estimated cost: \$750.

Teacher/Group Requests - In recent years, ABC paid for a field trip to the Mariposa Museum and History Center, upgraded quiz programs for Spanish and French teachers, covered travel costs for the Academic Decathlon, and more. We also regularly contribute \$600 to AAUW's Dinner with a Scientist event at UC Merced each fall. We look forward to funding more requests that benefit students! Estimated cost: \$3,600.

Personal Best Awards - At the beginning of each school year, MCHS staff work with students on setting goals. Given at the end of the year, Personal Best Awards will recognize at least one student in each grade level who has personally made significant progress toward their goals. MCHS is responsible for determining the details and the prizes. Cost: \$1,000.

Academic Achievement Night - Starting sophomore year, academic letters (for putting on sweaters or jackets or displaying on walls) are given to students who maintain a 3.5 or greater grade point average throughout the year in recognition of their hard work and positive outcomes. In subsequent years, students who previously earned letters are then eligible to earn bars to add to them. ABC is happy to sponsor the letters and bars given out at MCHS's Achievement Night at the end of each school year. Cost: \$400.

On the Right Track - We are in the planning stages for this program which will target seniors to make sure they are familiar with real life situations like how to open a bank account; getting a loan; working with lawyers; and so on. We are partnering with MotherLode Job Training to put together one full school day of activities. Students will be given one of four real life situations to work through, requiring each student to engage with organizations that can meet their needs and provide support. Coming fall 2020. Cost: TBD

Tara brought up the idea of a new program in collaboration with the County, Chamber of Commerce, and MotherLode Job Training. Calaveras County sponsors a program targeted at seniors to make sure they are familiar with real life situations like how to open a bank account; getting a loan; working with lawyers; and so on. In Calaveras, it's one full day of activities with organizations each represented in booths. Students are given one of 4 real life situations to work through.

Jill mentioned that in Grizzly U, freshman work on a 10 year plan and she is not sure what else. Even if there is overlap, it would be good to do a program like what Tara is suggesting senior year. It was suggested maybe what freshman worked on could be saved and shown to them during this program senior year.

Everyone liked the idea of doing a program similar to the Calaveras County program for MCHS students. Kathleen will check with Celeste to make sure it is of interest to administration. If it is, Kathleen will talk to her about possible days. Kathleen mentioned that in the fall (October?), freshman through juniors take the PSAT. This year, MCHS had activities for seniors in the gymnasium. Perhaps this could be the program we are discussing instead. That would be quick to get organized for this coming fall; Tara would like to plan for it for the spring at least for this coming school year. We will discuss this again at our planning meeting when we have an answer from Celeste and maybe some possible dates.

Update: Kathleen spoke with Celeste about this and Celeste likes the idea of doing it fall 2020 when all but the seniors are taking the PSAT (it was Oct 16 this year). That gives us plenty of time to plan and it will be easier to manage with 100+ students rather than 400+ students. This was, too, it can become an annual event.
